Budget Impact of ProEnergy Issue 7 Initiative

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OVERVIEW OF ISSUE 7

- ProEnergy seeks \$87M from the City of Columbus General Fund
 - Energy Conservation, Education and Subsidies
 - Where is the oversight/accountability?
- General Fund supports general City services such as:
 - Police and Fire
 - Refuse
 - Health
 - Recreation and Parks



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WHAT \$87M LOOKS LIKE?

Equivalent To:

- 10% of the General Fund Operating Budget
- Nearly the entire balance of the "Rainy Day" Fund
 - Projected 2022 Balance = \$89.5M
 - No other restricted reserve fund to pull from
 - Took over 10 years to replenish since 2008-09 Great Recession
- More Than The Total Budgets Of Essential Service Departments:
 - Division of Refuse (\$50M)
 - Department of Health (\$30M)
 - Recreation and Park Department (\$45M)



WHAT IS THE PLAN FROM THE CITY?

Several Options Would Have To Be Discussed

No specific solution, however some ideas would be:

- Layoffs?
- Potential Massive Reductions In All Budgets In General Fund?
 - Reduction In Services For The Community
- Use The Entire "Rainy Day" Fund?
 - Would jeopardize the City's AAA Bond Rating (Effects capital budgets)
 - No safety net for economic downturn!!
 - Would takes years to replenish
- <u>Cannot</u> Use Enterprise Funds (Public Utilities)
- Combination of options
