Commission Discussion

Chair Bartley stated that in light of the current Covid pandemic surge, etc. she would like to appoint a Vice Chair at the next meeting to cover, should she be unable to attend a meeting. - 3) Digitization of work re: use of modern technology in city offices
- 4) Gender neutrality within the Charter
- 5) Appointment of Acting Mayor
- 6) Part-time vs. Full-time Council members
- 7) Virtual meetings

Chair Bartley has received recommendations from the public for consideration, as well.



Commission recommendations need to be finalized no later than July 8, 2022 for consideration by City Council. Bi-weekly meetings are anticipated at this point. Some in the morning hours, and some in evening hours for convenience of the public that may wish to participate.

Commission members will review calendars and suggest future committee meeting dates/times. Mr. Oswalt will suggest date for second meeting via email. Public notice will follow.

Community Engagement

Mr. Oswalt reiterated that public notice will be given for all meetings and outreach to the community. The intention is that we do whatever we can to make it as convenient as possible for residents that wish to participate and offer comment. Discussion followed regarding how information can be widely disseminated.
