Presentation on the budget impact of Pro Energy Issue 7 Initiative by Joe Lombardi, Columbus' Director of Finance and Management.

Follow-up conversation on legal action available to the city if initiative petitions similar to Issue 7 were to succeed, whether initiative petitions with a budgetary impact similar to Issue 7 have appeared before, the specifics of how initiative petitions requiring funding receive such funds, and how legislated expenditures are enforced.

Presentation by Deputy City Auditor Darlene Wildes of a letter written by Auditor Kilgore, addressed to Columbus voters, on the dangers of Issue 7 in Fall 2021.

Presentation by Lara Baker-Morrish, Chief Counsel, City Attorney's office, on initiative petitions and self-dealing under the City Charter. The presentation included recommendations from the City Attorney's office on amendments to the City Charter to address this topic.

Commission Discussion

Chair Bartley stated that the next meeting will be used to go into more depth on City Attorney recommendations, ask questions, and discuss possible recommendations by the commission.
