## MEDICAID INFORMATION FOR UNDOCUMENTED INDIVIDUALS

### Alien Emergency Medical Assistance

**Description:** Provides coverage for the treatment of emergency medical conditions for certain individuals who do not meet Medicaid citizenship requirements.

**Eligibility:** Non-U.S. citizens who are not eligible for Medicaid.

### State Funded Medical Assistance for Non-Citizen Victims of Trafficking (NCVOT)

**Description:** Provides state-funded medical assistance to non-citizen victims of trafficking who have provided verification of the T-Visa application or evidence of human trafficking. Individuals must file a formal application for a T-Visa within one year of the medical assistance application date.

**Eligibility:** Non-citizen Individuals who are a victim of a severe form of human trafficking and are applying for, or preparing to apply for, a T Non-Immigration Status (T-Visa). Individuals must be an Ohio resident, have countable monthly income at or below 100% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL), and not have eligibility under another category of assistance.

### Refugee Medical Assistance

**Description:** Offers health coverage for a limited period of time to refugees upon their arrival in the United States. The purpose of RMA is to help refugees become self-sufficient as quickly as possible. Because this is a time-limited program, RMA is only available to qualifying refugees within the first eight months of entry to the U.S. Those who are found eligible will have access to the entire Medicaid benefit package.

**Eligibility:** Refugees who have been in the country for less than eight months, have an income up to 100% of the poverty level, and are ineligible for Medicaid. When applying for RMA, applicants must provide proof of income, pregnancy, citizenship and other health insurance (if applicable).
