- Opportunity to hear from the community about what is most important to them in this moment




Where Are We In The Process?

Public Meeting

A meeting was hosted to gain insight on what participants would like to see in German Village as it relates to parking.

Apr - May



Survey

A questionnaire was open for several weeks asking people their preferences and habits around parking, mobility, and safety.

Aug - Sep



Public Meeting

A meeting was hosted to share what has been learned through analysis and public engagement, and to test initial ideas.

Online Map

An interactive feedback map was available to provide input, mimicking the activities available at the first public meeting.

Technical Analysis


Parking counts and traffic analysis was conducted to better understand the existing conditions and how we currently manage our curbs.

Stakeholder Survey Results


- 854 responses total
- 729 residents responses
 - 47% have dedicated off-street parking
 - 84% are able to park on their street
 - 58% most difficult to parking between 3p-9p
 - 90% of guests park on the same block or within 2 blocks of visiting residents
- 21 employee responses
 - 86% drive
- 94 visitor responses
 - 85% drive
 - Most stay less than 3 hours



Key Takeaways from Survey & Feedback

General parking issues

- Higher demand evenings, weekends
- Expand permit parking and improved signage
- Desire to add on-street parking where feasible
- Options for employee and valet parking



Key Takeaways from Survey & Feedback

Roadway improvements


- Crosswalk enhancements
- Increased visibility at intersections
- Traffic calming & speed enforcement
 - Whittier, Thurman, Jaeger, 3rd


Enhanced mobility

- Improved sidewalks
- Protected bike lanes
- Bike parking
- Improved access to transit

Priorities for 3rd St and High St

- Walking
- **Biking**
- Speed management





Potential Recommendations

Expand permit parking

- Prioritizes residents while allowing for public parking
- Create consistent parking policy, no longer street-by-street approach
- Fill current gaps and determine appropriate boundaries based on demand
- Create clear, consistent signage
- Increase enforcement

Add on-street parking where feasible

Look at wider streets and determine if angled parking is appropriate

Potential Recommendations

Increase visibility at intersections

- Review current corner clearances and determine if signage is in proper location per City Code
- Some intersections may require the removal of parking

Bike facilities

- Place bike parking near attractions
- Study options for protected bike lanes
- Get involved in the Bike Plus Plan

Prioritize 3rd St and High St
