

Indicator Descriptions

<u>Biodiversity</u>: The level of focus and commitment to decreasing habitat fragmentation and habitat destruction while increasing the population of native species.

Energy: The level of focus and commitment to decreasing nonrenewable energy use and increasing renewable energy consumption.

<u>Collaboration</u>: The extent to which all members of the community (regardless of race, socioeconomic class, etc.) are included in the sustainability process.

<u>Materials</u>: The level of focus and commitment to building future communities, and improving existing communities, usage of green construction products.

<u>Waste</u>: The level of focus and commitment to decrease the amount of waste diverted to landfills and increase reuse/ recycling within the community.

<u>Transportation</u>: The level of focus and commitment to decrease high emission transportation while increasing public transportation and green options, such as biking.

<u>Health/Well-being</u>: The level of focus and commitment to improving the social pillar of sustainability via the physical and mental health of community members.

<u>Water</u>: The level of focus and commitment to decreasing water pollution and increase awareness of community members' water usage.

<u>Community Outreach</u>: The extent to which community members are involved in the implementation process and their capacity to understand consequences of individual actions via education and awareness.

<u>Cost</u>: The expense associated with implementing the program on ranges of personal to community scales.

<u>Existing Process</u>: The extent to which a process, which can be easily mimicked, is obtainable by community members to discuss the possibility of implementation.

<u>Outcome</u>: The associated benefits to be generated by execution of the program.
