2021 Utility Rates Announced

Sewer, stormwater and water utility fees for 2021 were recently approved by the Columbus Sewer and Water Advisory Board and Columbus City Council, following a public hearing. The rate structure will allow the department to continue to provide quality water and sewer services and reinvest in Columbus' aging infrastructure. It will also sustain an ongoing capital improvement program, which helps the quality of life in neighborhoods and also supports businesses and economic growth in the central Ohio area.

Major treatment upgrades to the city's three drinking water plants have been completed by the Division of Water over the past few years to meet updated Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (OEPA) regulations and address infrastructure and future growth needs. Treatment plant improvements currently in construction at the Dublin Road and Hap Cremean water plants include the addition of ultraviolet disinfection. Backup power capability was recently put online at the Dublin Road plant and will be online the first quarter of this year at the Hap Cremean plant. The department plans to begin upgrading outdated meters for all water/sewer and city power customers in 2021, which will provide many customer benefits. Look for more information on this, known as the Enhanced Meter Project, in a future newsletter. Waterline rehabilitation and replacement projects will also continue to reduce waterline breaks and improve reliability.

In the Division of Sewerage and Drainage, many wet weather management plan improvements will continue in order to meet consent order requirements with the state to reduce sewer overflows. Many projects under the Blueprint Columbus program, the OEPA-approved green alternative to the original plan, are underway and planned in several Columbus neighborhoods. Following major upgrades at the city's two wastewater treatment plants the past several years, at the Southerly Wastewater Treatment Plant the Chemically Enhanced Primary Treatment project was recently completed, which added 110 million gallons per day of high rate treatment capacity. Other ongoing improvements include upgrades to the city's sanitary and stormwater collection systems.

This year's rate structure includes modest increases: a 2% increase in water, a 3% increase in sewer, and a 1% increase in Columbus stormwater rates. An average consumption quarterly bill of \$295.15 in Columbus will go to about \$302.50, an increase of \$7.35 per quarter, or a 2.49% average increase. Approved low-income customers will see a 2.47% average increase, and outside Columbus customers a 2.51%. increase. Differences in bills will vary based on actual water consumption. Columbus' water and sewer rates remain some of the lowest in the region; our rates remain lower than Cleveland, Pittsburgh and Indianapolis. Columbus' tap water -- meeting or surpassing all state and federal drinking water standards -- remains a great value at less than a penny a gallon.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic that began in 2020 with accompanying economic challenges, we know that some of our customers have found themselves not always able to pay all their bills. If you are among them,

Payment plan arrangements and other forms of assistance are available, and our low income and senior discount programs will continue for those that qualify. If you do not have internet access, please call Customer Service for help at 614-645-8276, Monday - Friday, 7:00 AM to 6:00 PM. For your convenience, a low income discount application that could qualify you to receive 20% off future water and sewer consumption charges is on the reverse side. Income eligibility is based on 150% of the current federal poverty level.
